



## BIBLE STUDY RECAP

### VISION AND KEY CONTENT

Our goal is to provide constructive feedback and reflection to help our Commissioned Disciples lead excellent Bible studies. These conversations are best had directly after Bible study, but after or during discipleship is also possible. They are meant to be short (10-15 min) and happen multiple times so that the disciple can continually improve.

- Discipler gives feedback and/or asks strong open ended questions to prompt fruitful reflection on Bible study
- Commissioned Disciple leaves the conversation with 2-3 concrete points of planned improvement

### FEEDBACK

If the discipler attended the study, use the SWOT model to offer the Commissioned Disciple one of each of the following:

- **Strength:** Something that's already excellent
- **Weakness:** Most impactful area to improve
- **Opportunity:** Most exciting next growth point
- **Threat:** Potential future issue

If helpful, the Commissioned Disciple can "SWOT" their own study as well. Additionally, the discipler might also share ways in which they had to grow as a Bible study leader in the past.

### REFLECTION

Regardless of whether the discipler attended the study or not, any combination of the following prompt strong reflection. Choose 1-2 that are most relevant:

- What was the one "main" point of that bible study? Did you participants grasp that point by the end?
- What goals of bible study (authentic friendship, divine intimacy, and the little way of evangelization) do you think you best emphasized, and which do you want to grow in highlighting?
- Which role (trail guide, traffic cop, or cheerleader) do you feel like you lived into well? Which role do you need to grow in to best lead the bible study? How?
- What are ways you believe you prepared well for bible study? What is one way you want to prepare better for next time?

- What are 1-2 things you learned tonight about each person in study? What are ways you can show your gratitude for everyone that came to bible study? How can you “thank” them for coming and participating?
- How did you invite the people that attended to bible study? How did you invite those that did not attend bible study? What approach might you change to invite people to come for the first time?
- Who spoke the most at bible study? How can you help facilitate discussion across the board?
- What would take this bible study from “good enough” to the highlight of someone’s week?
